
Don't fall for it.

Neither do studies conclusively demonstrate that particle (e.g., dust) levels

in homes increase because of dirty air ducts. This is because much of the dirt in air ducts adheres to duct surfaces and does not necessarily enter the living space."

Duct Cleaning Disasters

Ductwork is a major part of any central heating and air conditioning system. Made of a thin inner vinyl lining with a "slinkee" style stainless steel spring embedded inside, ductwork is typically wrapped in pink fiberglass and then encased in a second layer of vinyl. Duct cleaning machines are either vigorous enough

to tear the vinyl itself, or so soft they can't strip out any embedded dirt. How to Prep Your SoCal Home

Simple Plans Make for a Safe Home

Don't get us wrong. We love living in Southern California. However, living in the area also comes with natural hazards. Earthquakes and wildfires are always seasonal risks, and for those of us in the foothill communities, even the occasional bear is a thing. Prepare your family and your home for these events for peace of mind.

Here are some tips on how to get started:

Earthquake Readiness

Securing your home is essential. Bolt down or strap bookshelves and cabinets

to prevent them from toppling during a quake. Use straps to secure your water heater, and think about appropriate safety retrofits in older homes to safeguard against seismic activity. Most important: keep an emergency kit with three days of dry food, water, any necessary daily medications, and first-aid supplies accessible in the garage or where you can get to it in an emergency (tucked away in an attic or basement is probably not ideal).

Fire Safety

Create a defensible space around your home by clearing all dry vegetation, dead trees, and flammable materials. Use fireresistant plants in your landscaping and keep gutters clean to prevent embers from igniting your home. Install smoke alarms on every floor and test them often.



Bear encounters happen regularly in our foothill communities. Secure your trash cans with bear-proof lids and avoid leaving pet food outside or in your car. If you see a bear, keep your distance and avoid direct contact. Do not try to pet or engage these animals, and keep your pets away from them. No good can come from a dog barking at a bear, either for the dog or the bear itself. Keep your doors and windows secure, and lock your car doors.

Minimize risk for you and your family with these precautions. We live in a beautiful area. Be prepared to handle whatever Mother Nature throws your way with a little preplanning.
